BRANCH PRESIDENT'S CORNER

My first item of interest this month is the cost of our newsletter. Our fiscal year ends 30 June 2009. Our projected income from membership and fund raisers is \$21,085.00. The projected cost of printing and mailing the newsletter to our members will cost \$5,263.00. That is almost 25% of our income. The cost of the newsletter is almost the amount we have spent on Americanism/Patriotism, Youth Activities, and Hospital/Welfare and Rehab. As of March 2009, we have spent \$5,422.00 on these activities. The newsletter is available on our web site, www.fra269.org. In this IT world, most of our members have access to the internet. Please contact Shipmate Darlene Hines and ask to be removed from the mailing list. Those that do not have access to the internet, we will gladly continue to send the newsletter to you by mail. Please make sure your address is correct or changed if you move, the Post Office charges us 42 cents for every returned letter. In May, postage is going up.

My second item is Membership and Retention. As of 31 March 2009, we have 976 members in good standing. This is the membership number used by National and Regional officials to determine our voting strength for the upcoming conventions. We barely have stayed a Group 1 Branch, one of two in the Southeast Region and one of nine in the nation. 31 March 2008 we had 1011 members in good standing. Whether we stay a Group 1 or Group 2 Branch is not a big concern of mine, the bigger concern is the decline in the overall membership in the FRA. As the leading voice on Capitol Hill for current and former enlisted Sea Service members, I worry that our voice is weakening. There's great strength in numbers. Congress knows that, and so do you. The FRA works tirelessly to preserve and enhance pay, benefits and quality-of-life programs for all its members. If you're worried about your eroding benefits, your medical cost going up, and various other items I here you talk about at the "Fleet", I have an easy solution for you. Recruit one member, and retain one of your Shipmates! It's as simple as that.

We had the first round of nominations for Branch and Home Committee officers and BODs last month. The list should be printed elsewhere in the newsletter. At this month's meeting there will be another round of nominations prior to elections. If you want to make a difference, participate.
