MADAM PREZ'S TIDBIT

I hope that everyone is in school and that you are ready for fall. We will be undertaking some fundraisers (details at a later date). We advertise heavily at the Home, so check the bulletin boards.

A little bit of history: The POW/MIA table. I know that you may have noticed this small table in the foyer with its guard of rope and stanchion. It set for one. This table is our way of symbolizing that members of our Association are missing from our midst. They are commonly called POW'S or MIA'S...we call them brothers. They are unable to be with us and so we remember them.

The table set for one is small...it symbolizes the frailty of one prisoner against his oppressors. The tablecloth is white...it symbolizes the purity of their intentions to respond to their country's call to arms. A slice of lemon is on the plate...to remind us of their bitter fate. There is salt on the plate...symbolic of the family's tears as they wait.

The single rose displayed in a vase reminds us of the families and loved ones of our comrades in arms who keep faith while awaiting their return. The red ribbon tied so prominently on the vase is reminiscent of the red ribbon worn on the lapel and breasts of thousands who bear witness to their unyielding determination to demand a proper accounting for our missing brothers and sisters.

The glass is inverted...they can not join with us in a toast. The chair is empty...they are not here.

Remember...all of you who served with them and called them comrades, who depended on their might and aid, and relied on them...for surely ...they, have not forsaken you.

If you are celebrating a happy occasion, have great time. If you or someone you know is ill or in the hospital, please get well soon. My sincere condolences if you have suffered a loss.
